...And for give us our doubts, as we forgive our doubters.

Perhaps we are not going to finally get to some stable place of having it all figured out.

Throughout our lives we will go through the processes of opening to new information, integrating it, and stabilizing our worldview.

What does spiritual growth really mean to us? Most of us found ourselves on a spiritual path because we were looking for "more," because we instinctively knew that there was something beyond the material world that could sustain us, nourish us, and fill our hearts.
