

Angels aren't always floating around singing \checkmark Hallelujah \checkmark or hovering above the manger. There are times when someone comes into our life at precisely the right time and says or does precisely the right thing. Their words or actions may help us through a difficult incidence, or help us to understand a complexity. The experience reminds us that things can turn out for the best, or that we can cope.
