
# We're Open Every Sunday

Spring has arrived! When I think about Spring, flowers are coming up and trees are showing their leaves. I think of new beginnings and fresh starts. In the past few months, I have been doing articles about our past, as we celebrate 50 years in Palos Park. This month I am thinking about our future and a fresh start for our church. So exactly who are we? What is our vision? Where are we headed?

The Trustees have asked Pastor Moore to help the congregation develop our vision. Starting in April, he will lead us on a journey over the next eight weeks to develop the statement. As a congregation everyone is encouraged to provide their input in planning for our future. Please take some time during coffee hour to participate in these discussions.

I look around the church and see excitement growing. Our Minister and Christian Education Director are bringing new energy to our congregation. I am amazed at all the activity occurring in the church throughout the month. The church seems to love to eat. In March we had a chili cook-off, a well-attended Bunny Breakfast, a special Cooking Club and an Easter breakfast. The Board of Christian Education and our Peace Kids did an amazing job at creating Easter baskets for a local Women's shelter. The kids really enjoyed creating the baskets. What a great way to share with our community. Thank you to everyone that made all these events happen. I can't wait to see what happens in the month of April.

I want to take a moment to give you an update of what is happening regarding capital improvements. The chiller that cools the LifeStyles Academy/Christian Education wing is quickly nearing the end of it's lifespan. The Building and Grounds committee has made recommendations on a replacement. They obtained bids and

have submitted them to the Trustees for approval. Bids for replacement of flooring in the gym are also being completed. If you are not aware the tiles in the gym have been coming up and the floor needs to be replaced. A third concern is the lighting in the Sanctuary. As we read about in a past Messenger article, a committee has been established to make recommendations on how the lightening can be improved. These major projects are crucial and need to be completed this year. I expect the cost will be beyond the capital budget approved for 2024. We may need to come back to the congregation to discuss the funding. The Trustees will be looking at how to fund these projects and possibly others. This may include doing additional fundraising or using some proceeds from the sale of the Peace Memorial Residences. I will do my best to keep you updated on where all of this is headed.

# This month I'd like to give a shout out to our Music and Worship Committee



### Peace Memorial Church, A View to Our Church's History, Chapter One

Although I don't want this effort to become a series of boring history lectures, I think much of this information will be new to many of our younger members and new congregants. Sometimes it's important to know where we've come from to get a better idea of where we may be headed. I would encourage anyone with questions regarding the history of PMC, or suggestions of what they would like to see in future articles to let me know. From the very beginning, here we go! On August 9, 1886 fourteen immigrant men from Germany and Austria formed "Die Evangelischen Friedens Gemeinde" (The

Evangelical Church of Peace) at 1309 W. 47<sup>th</sup> Street in the "Back of the Yards' community. Nine days later construction was begun on the church's first building, a schoolhouse and teacher's residence! Classes at the school were taught in German in an attempt to preserve the culture. By October of 1886, a constitution for the church was established and signed by its 41 members. The first confirmation class, of 10 students was confirmed in 1887. Just five years later that number had more than tripled with 34 confirmands!

The congregation grew by leaps and bounds to 1,000 members in 1904 and 1,725 members by 1905. This growth in numbers was undoubtedly aided by land acquisition, new construction and opening of branches in surrounding communities. Land was donated and additional land purchased at 52<sup>nd</sup> and Justine, not far from the original structure, and construction of a gothic style church began. The entire cost of this endeavor was \$7,450.00! The branch Sunday schools operated at 49<sup>th</sup> and Western and 62<sup>nd</sup> and Lincoln (now Wolcott), both closed in the early 1920's.

Shortly after the closings of the remote branches, in 1922, the church purchased an entire block of property bounded by 78<sup>th</sup> Street on the south, 77<sup>th</sup> Street on the north, Laflin to the west, and Bishop to the east. This acquisition was to be the site of a very large church, a parish house (community center), and a parsonage. The cost of an entire city block in 1922? A whopping \$21,000.00!! In addition to the property designated for the church construction, 26 individual lots (30' by 170') were purchased by church members to offset construction costs. This same land acquisition concept helped fund the Peace Memorial Convalescent Home in Evergreen Park several years later, but that's a story for another day.

In future chapters of this series, we will cover more church history with at least one dedicated to PMC leadership, Lay and Pastoral, and visions for our future. Please do not hesitate to let me know if you have any questions or suggestions for inclusion in future chapters.


