Moore thoughts...Pastor Kirk's Ponderings –

A World Made Whole



The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom like the crocus. It shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and shouting. (Isaiah 35: 1-2)

Isaiah 35 reflects on the important relationship between human activity and the environment, It draws parallels between scripture and the environmental challenges of today. The passage emphasizes

the impact of human actions on the landscape, illustrating how unchecked expansion and ecological mismanagement contribute to famine and wildfires. The ancient text shows us that despite technological advancements, human greed, indifference, the endless pursuit of power, and hopelessness slow or interrupt necessary healing of the environment.

How can we imagine together a world made whole? Can we be physicians of the environment? Caregivers of the land? Our collective stewardship and generosity can be healing. Together we can actively recreate healthy environments in our yards, churches, and towns. It is our collective effort that fosters hope in hearts that may be filled with despair.

In this season of stewardship, let's imagine together what it means to not only

be caregivers of the land, but also a people who work to heal the rift. Let us, in our giving, and in our very lives, seek to live out, and work for, liberation of the oppressed and a just and lasting peace in the world. Working toward a world made whole is doing the work God calls us to.

There are many ways to support the ministry of PMC, and in the next weeks we ask everyone to think in a particular and prayerful way about the choices we make with our money to support the church. It will all culminate on Stewardship Sunday, November 10, as part of our worship service. You should be receiving stewardship materials for 2025 in the mail in the next couple of days, if you haven't received them already.


