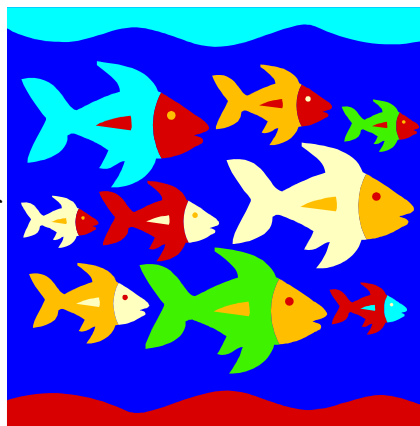

## Lay Visitation News

The tenth "Barrier to Good Listening" adapted from Lay Shepherding by Rudolph E. Grantham, is "shock in the listener about what has been said."

Who among us hasn't (at one time or another) been having a conversation with another person when all of a sudden the person said something so shocking that we immediately stopped listening to whatever followed the very surprising comment just made? However, by being shocked into not listening any further to what was being said, we didn't hear the explanation that might have followed!

Furthermore, our so-called "shock" assumed that the statement was "out of line" or "completely false". In other words we felt "our" opinion on the subject being discussed was the only "true one"!

Obviously, this is a barrier to good listening, because we must remember that a conversation is a "give and take" between two (or more) people. No human being has the corner on truth! We all live by faith, and must realize that everyone we meet has a different background and is shaped by both biological and environmental factors. Besides, the day you happened to converse with the person may have been one when he or she had major aches and pains, and was not in a compassionate and forgiving frame of mind!

As for as being "shocked" by any comments when making a Lay Visitation to a homebound or nursing home church member, I don't believe it happens very often. If it does happen, it usually means the Lay Visitor is "new" in this important ministry, and hasn't dealt with the complexities and variations of human response from individuals.

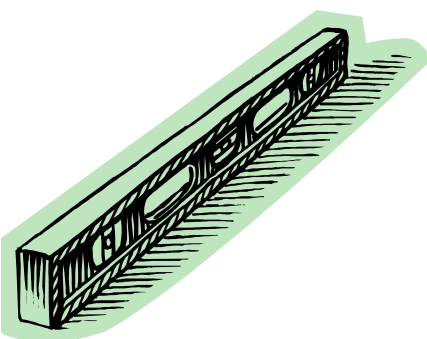

*Apparently, the word could show up anywhere — even on sugar, flour or salt spilled on a kitchen counter. The game lasted a lifetime.*

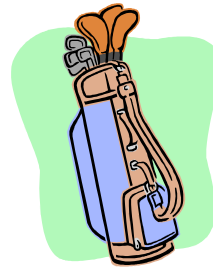

So I challenge you, pass on SHMILY! You will be glad you did.

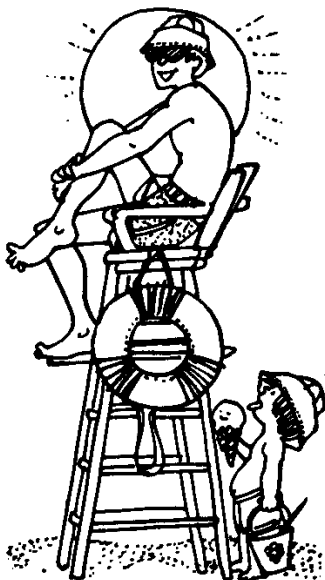

## More on Mental Illness

Last month we discussed the fourth area of self care (our Social/Relational Life) taken from Dr. Steve J. Kim's article entitled "Sound Mind, Sound Body."

This month we will briefly discuss the fifth area which is our Spiritual Life.

Broadly speaking, what I mean by the spiritual life is that part of life which still remains a mystery even in the face of the latest scientific and medical research. It is, an openness to that which is transcendent yet imminent/incarnate. Spirituality includes our sense of value, meaning, purpose, and direction in life. It is learning to trust and surrender to the goodness of life itself, even in the face of tragedy. Trust asks us to have faith, and we have to exercise faith at some level in life to maintain sanity. For some people, this may be a faith in God or "higher power as we understand it" as expressed in AA and other 12-step groups. Cultivating one's spiritual life offers hope during times of stress and despair. A paradox in life is that we can find strength when we are weak. Some of the spiritual practices which have been found to be helpful for some people include regular times of prayer, meditation/contemplation, spiritual reading, awareness/mindfulness training, living in the present moment, cultivating gratitude and unconditional love, taking a quiet, reflective walk, intentionally carving out times for solitude/silence/stillness, volunteerism/acts of service, practicing the presence of God, fellowship/community support groups, and many others.

## PMC Is Going Green!

Did you know that Waste Management alone recycled 30,000 tons of aluminum last year? Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a 100-watt bulb for 20 hours, a computer for 3 hours, or a TV for 2 hours. ([EPA, 2008](#)) This means that Waste Management was able to save enough energy to power a television for over six BILLION hours! Here are some other recycling facts:



\*Americans throw away enough aluminum every month to rebuild our entire commercial air fleet.

\*Glass never wears out -- it can be recycled forever. We save over a ton of resources for every ton of glass recycled -- 1,330 pounds of sand, 433 pounds of soda ash, 433 pounds of limestone, and 151 pounds of feldspar.

\*If every American household recycled just one out of every ten HDPE bottles they used, we'd keep 200 million pounds of the plastic out of landfills every year.

\*Styrofoam is un-recyclable - you can't make it into new Styrofoam. The industry wants you to assume it is- don't BUY it!

We now have a recycling container outside Zion Hall kitchen where our trash dumpsters are. It is marked for recycling and we are able to recycle the following: flattened cardboard, paperboard cartons, paper cardboard (dairy and juice containers), plastic bottles and containers (#1-7), glass bottles and jars, aluminum cans, aluminum foil and pie tins, and tin or steel cans. We will have laminated posters with the above list posted around church so you don't have to memorize it!

**WE ARE STILL RECYCLING ALL PAPER IN THE GREEN/YELLOW RECEPTACLES IN THE PARKING LOT.** The church earns money with this project, so keep up the good work!
